Course Updates

- applied pre & post emergence throughout Blue H & MH to help reduce weed infestation now & any future weed pressure
- calibrated all spraying equipment for pre & post emergence control for more accurate application of pesticides
- cleaned off debris on Blue H & MH to ensure better pre & post emergence control
- removed several trees & stump ground some
- made new tee markers for Blue H & MH
- re-stained & painted yardage posts for Blue H & Blackheath
- over-hauled equipment (sharpening reels, worked on hydraulic banks, oil changes, etc.) for the upcoming year

Goals for February

- roll Blue H greens
- finish spraying pre & post emergence control on dormant Bermuda grass for Black H, driving range & clubhouse grounds
- continue with leaf removal
- finish winter tree removal
- order new amenities for the upcoming golf season

Old Business

Status – marking sprinkler heads – distance data has been collected; has been put on the list of items to be completed

Update on maintenance employees for 2009 – possibly working with temp agency to fill jobs previously done by H2B workers

New Business

Cutting the fairways closer to the tees, particularly on MH - will be done wherever possible (drainage is most often the issue)

Distances between tee markers doesn't match scorecard - will be referred to Pro shop

Goose droppings on greens - are removed every day 99% of the time; more of an issue in winter – in season, geese tend to stay away from treated greens (pesticides, etc.)

OB stakes on #18 MH beyond bunker - will check to see if they're in the proper place; will also replace any broken stakes

Roll greens in winter? - can't roll frozen greens & don't usually roll them in winter; last rolled Blue H on 2/2/09; takes about 8 hours to roll one course

Sink holes, particularly on Black H - will address them when they can; labor intensive to repair; some are too big for in-house repair (e.g. #4 Black, left side close to green)

Course Updates

March Accomplishments

- Aerified, rolled, top-dressed and fertilized all greens
- Brought up irrigation & started trouble shooting problems as well as fixing leaks (MH # 13 & Blk #3)
- Installed new pressure sensor on Blk pump station
- Fixed a half dozen sink holes on Blk #7
- Sprayed all greens to try to reduce poa-annua issues & applied fungicide
- Increased crew size by 5 full time employees & several part-time workers
- Received 2009 amenities (new hazard stakes, etc.); began to set up all courses for the season
- Worked on ball washers & put out water fountains
- Filled divots with sand on all courses – MGA project

Goals for April

- ❖ Continue installing new amenities & setting up courses for the season
- ❖ Bring out equipment; resume seasonal mowing & training of new employees
- ❖ Begin marking distances on sprinkler heads for MH & Blue (Blk is done)
- ❖ Continue trouble shooting irrigation problems
- ❖ Continue to work on sink holes on Blackheath
- ❖ Continue working on ball washers, etc.

Old Business

Status – marking sprinkler heads – will be completed when weather warms up (application of labels needs warmth in order to stay in place)

Status Update – maintenance employees – hired 5 full time & several part-time employees; will hire more as season gets in to full swing

Update - #16 MH pruning of trees to right of fairway bunker – dead tree and limbs removed

Update - #3 Blue – 100 yd. marker blocked by bushes – corrected

Status update – sinkholes – fixed 6 on Blk #7; will work on Blk #6 next

New Business

Maintenance of practice ranges -> this falls under the jurisdiction of the Pro shop

Open Discussion

MGA sand divot project discussed. Ralph Box suggested that, if effective, perhaps it should be done more often. Steve responded that it definitely helps & if the MGA chooses to do it again, perhaps twice a year – spring & fall – would be sufficient.

Changes to Blue Heron were discussed. Steve emphasized that they would maintain 3 sets of tees, with the position of the gold tees remaining relatively the same. He & his staff will be happy to comply with any choice of tee positions requested by the MGA or LGA, as long as his staff is given enough advance notice to fulfill the request.

Question regarding consistency of types of sand in bunkers was discussed. Steve said it varies from course to course based on when the course was built. Blue & Black are the most similar. Marsh Hawk's sand is different from the other two. Within MH itself, the sand in fairway bunkers differs from the sand in greenside bunkers, due to the fact that when the greens were redone, different sand was used.

Course Updates

April Accomplishments

- Increased staff size & working on filling other positions
- Mowed all golf courses wall to wall
- Edged all yardage plaques (tees & fwys); installed yardage stickers on MH irrigation heads
- Evaluated turf stands breaking out of dormancy & made agronomic decisions
- Reworked area next to curb at #15 Blue to help alleviate standing water issue
- Sodded mulch bed on MH #3 tee & behind Black #7 green
- Worked on Black #7 drains
- Sprayed growth regulator on greens of MH & Blue #5-13 to control Poa
- Started to work on bed areas throughout the courses
- Marked all hazards
- Worked on several irrigation problems (MH #2, #12 green, etc.)

Goals for May

- Install yardages on Blue sprinkler heads
- Fertilize all Bermuda
- Fix Black pump station (bad check valve on 1 pump & flow meter issue)
- Aerify greens

Old Business

Status – marking sprinkler heads – MH completed; Blue will be done in May

Status Update – maintenance employees – hired more & will continue to do so in May; easier to manage training hiring a few at a time

Status update – sinkholes – repairs completed so far have held; will continue to do more on Blackheath

New Business

Placing sand bottles by the first tee of each course was discussed. Steve said that the sand bottles are under the Pro Shop's jurisdiction; also, the bottles disappeared when they were in the racks by the starter's post & by MH #10.

Questions about golf course conditions were discussed – slow greens with some being particularly bumpy & full of Poa & a lot of weeds in various parts of the courses. Steve responded that the greens are all cut at the same height all season; growth regulator has been applied to control the Poa; and the weeds will be sprayed when the bermuda has fully emerged from dormancy (to do it sooner would damage the bermuda). Also, he said that it takes years to actually eliminate all the Poa from a green.

A question was asked about the status of the black tees on Blue Heron, i.e. would they be cut or allowed to go to seed. Steve said that they would be cut to the same 1" height as the rest of the course and that it would not be difficult to return them back to their original condition.

Steve was asked if flags that were missing on the driving range could be replaced. This also falls under the Pro Shop's jurisdiction; however Steve said that they would replace them.

Open Discussion

Betsy reported that the ladies' room bathroom door lock on #4 Blue was not working. Steve responded that this needed to be reported to Larry Spielberg.

Frank McMorrow asked about the drainage area on Black #1 (to the right of the cart path just past the right fairway bunker) and how it should be marked. This question will be referred to the Golf/HRT committee.

Course Updates

May Accomplishments

- Fertilized all the Bermuda grass
- Installed summer annuals around clubhouse grounds
- Started to sod weaker areas throughout the courses, mainly Marsh Hawk tees & green surrounds & Blackheath tees
- Installed yardage stickers on Blue Heron sprinkler heads
- Watered all Bermuda & started trouble shooting all irrigation problems
- Aerified, rolled, top-dressed & fertilized Marsh & Blackheath's greens as well as one practice green, 2 nurseries & member chipping green
- Edged all bunkers
- Started to spray for weeds throughout the golf courses
- Pushed up washed out bunkers several times throughout the month
- Fixed Blackheath's pump station by replacing one check valve & repairing flow meter
- Applied wetting agents on greens to improve water retention

Goals for June

- ❖ Fertilize weaker areas throughout golf courses to promote Bermuda grass growth
- ❖ Continue to sod weaker areas throughout the golf courses
- ❖ Continue with weed control (cautious because of weak turf stand)
- ❖ After sod has been established in sodded areas, top-dress with sand to level those areas
- ❖ Aerify Blue Heron greens on the 8th & 9th
- ❖ Apply growth regulator to all fairways
- ❖ Install fans at greens on Blue Heron
- ❖ Continue to work on sink holes on Blackheath

Old Business

Status – marking sprinkler heads – Completed; if any are missing, notify Steve

Status – employees – hired a few more & working on training – difficult because most don't know much about golf; there are 7/8 full time & about 15 part-time

Status – sinkholes – one more to repair on #7 Black & then will move to #6 Black

New Business

The committee received numerous emails and comments from members about course conditions, particularly about weeds throughout the golf course and the condition of some of the tees. Steve agreed that the weeds have been prolific and explained that we have not had enough “Bermuda growth” weather. Normally, the Bermuda would choke out the weeds. Instead, the Bermuda stayed dormant longer, but the weeds grew and they could not be sprayed until the Bermuda had grown in. He added that they followed the same process this year to take care of the golf courses that they’ve used in previous years, but the longer, colder winter and cooler spring have definitely been factors in producing what we’re seeing.

The round brown spots are called Spring dead spot, which is a fungus that establishes itself in the fall but is not visible until the spring. It can be treated in the fall but because it’s not visible, all areas would have to be treated. The necessary chemicals are very expensive and, more importantly, there are no guarantees that all of the “infected” areas would get treated. Steve also expressed concern about the overuse of chemicals.

Steve agreed that some of the tees are in poor condition and will be working on improving them throughout the month of June. He will also redouble his efforts to train the new employees to rotate the position of the tee markers more frequently to prevent overuse in a given area.

A question about the necessity of aerifying greens so frequently was discussed. Steve responded that it’s necessary to maintain the health of the greens throughout the summer and fall. They will continue to aerify three times throughout the season. The USGA’s recommendation is to remove 20% of a green’s surface area per year. Since this can’t be done all at once (would destroy the green), it has to be spread out throughout the season.

The temporary cups are still on Blue Heron greens because it saves maintenance time.

They are addressing the algae growth on Blue Heron #3 pond, as well as the poison ivy in various parts of the golf courses.

The decision to eliminate the 1st cut of rough on Marsh & Blackheath was made by upper management. I was asked to refer this issue to the CCMA board.

Old Business

Status – repairing sinkholes – completed #7 Black; will begin working on #6 Black

Status – employees – pleased with progress in training new employees; total # of employees – 42 in '09, compared to 44 in '08

New Business

It was suggested that perhaps some kind of netting could be placed over the largest sinkholes to prevent golf balls from being lost in them. Steve agreed to work on this.

The poor condition of areas surrounding some of the bunkers was discussed. Steve agreed and said that it's very difficult to repair, particularly if it's an "access" area for the sand pro. It's also labor intensive. The committee suggested that we could identify the worst ones & give a prioritized list to Steve who agreed to work on it whenever he could.

Tread and oil marks on some of the greens were caused by leaking equipment which has since been repaired.

Anticipated savings for Blue Heron was discussed. Savings are definitely being realized, particularly in labor. Two part-time workers are able to do all of the cutting where, when cutting fairways, it used to take two full time workers to complete everything. Steve explained that two different types of mowers are used when cutting the 1" height vs. the fairway height and the mower used to cut fairways is much slower.

Immigrant workers obtained for the Golden Horseshoe – is this worth pursuing? Steve explained that he did use the same temp agency as GH did and that it is expensive. The agency charges 30% above what the workers are paid. Some workers showed an interest but when asked to complete the paperwork, they did not show up the next day. Others worked for a few days and then quit. Steve said that he finally had three out of the entire group stay.

Open Discussion

Steve was asked if our equipment is up to date and running well. He reported that most of the equipment is new in the last 3 – 4 years and it is not a problem to maintain.

Course Updates

July Accomplishments

- Aerified all Bermuda grass, as well as cleaned all the debris associated with aerification
- Fertilized Marsh Hawk tees, fairways & green complexes
- Fertilized Blue Heron tees and green complexes
- Applied growth regulator to Marsh Hawk fairways to reduce mowing frequency and grass clippings
- Needle tined all greens
- Replaced 15" galvanized pipe on Blue Heron #1 with 15" plastic pipe
- Rerouted water line to a row of heads located between #2 & #7 on MH
- Fixed irrigation leaks on Blue Heron #4 & #15 tee, Blackheath #13 tee & numerous boxes & heads throughout all three courses
- Removed oak tree from Blue Heron #13 tee area

Old Business

Status – protective covering over sinkholes – tried one method – too dangerous; will make sure they are well marked.

New Business

Geese – nothing can be done this year as far as having the geese removed; can try for next year – keep in mind that it's very costly; perhaps cost could be shared by country club and HOA.

‘Dumping’ issue - areas in question, brought up by member, include #12 & #13 MH & #13 Blue; Steve investigated all & said that #13 Blue is not coming from the golf course but the other areas are. Steve said that there are limited disposal areas left & it is too costly to have all of the debris hauled out. While these areas are not “in play”, Steve said they will try to prevent them from becoming too unsightly.

Cutting on Blue #11 #12 – question has been asked by several members about whether the cutting on Blue #11 & #12 around the pond has to be so severe. Steve’s response - it would be too costly (labor) to try to selectively cut it but perhaps they could try cutting only once a year instead of twice – TBD.

Blue Heron – Fairway Cuts – Steve & crew are still working on the configuration & lengths of the fairways. Their goal is to be able to accomplish all of the cutting in 6 hours so that there is still some savings involved, but at the same time responding to members’ requests to return to having fairways.

Blue Heron #3 – Bridge – member expressed concern about rotting areas on the bridge; Steve said they will inspect it and repair or replace any areas that are dangerous or becoming so.

Open Discussion

Steve requested that all members keep **both golf carts and pull carts at least 25-30 yards** from the greens. He said that pull carts are actually worse (pounds per square inch) and do more damage than golf carts. This message will be passed along to the MGA, LGA, 4 T’s and Social with Golf. We will ask the Pro shop to request that outside groups comply with this as well. Larry will be copied and Melissa will be asked to put the request in the next Scorecard.

Course Updates

August Accomplishments

- Prepared for club championship
- Helped reestablish fairways on Blue Heron by shaping, cutting, fertilizing and applying a growth regulator
- Applied growth regulator to Marsh Hawk fairways to reduce mowing frequency and grass clippings
- Needle tined greens on Blackheath & Marsh Hawk
- Continued with cleanup from pipe project on Blue Heron #1
- Took down some small trees & weeds impeding view of Blue #13 green
- Fixed irrigation leak on Blue Heron #13 & repaired numerous boxes & heads throughout all three courses
- Repaired Blackheath pump station

Old Business

Status - Sinkholes – new one has formed on Blackheath #7 – middle of fairway – will be added to the list of those needing repair

New Business

Blue Heron – the committee passed along to staff the many favorable comments about conditions and new fairway cuts

General Conditions – many favorable comments have been received, particularly during the Club Championship

Tall Weeds Around Ponds – On Blackheath #5, 12 & 16, tall weeds (“dog fennel”) were starting to restrict view and low shots to the greens; Steve has taken care of these holes, however, we all noticed that they have grown up around all of the ponds. Steve said they would take care of it as soon as they can.

Bees – Marsh Hawk #16 - Steve said that they were not visible when he went out to look for them but they will continue to monitor the situation.

Bunkers – Steve is aware of the condition of the bunkers and will work to improve them. They are raked a minimum of 3-4x/week, as well as for special events.

Ball Washers – many have been dry lately. Steve said that they are supposed to be checked daily by the person who does the tees and trash. Steve will check to be sure that it's being done.

Carts Too Close to Greens – the committee asked Steve if they had seen any improvement in members keeping carts away from greens. Steve responded that there was some improvement but many are still taking carts between bunkers and greens, including on the collars of the greens. The committee responded that they would ask the associations to emphasize it again.

Open Discussion

There was some discussion about the position of some of the indicator flags (denoting front, middle & back hole positions) being inaccurate. Steve agreed that there are some that depend on perspective and the criteria for placement. Members of the committee will meet with Steve in October to investigate a “standard” to use for hole indicators on the questionable holes.

It was brought up that there are some signs where the lettering has worn off. Steve said they will be repainted.

Steve was asked to check on some of the pedestal drinking fountains. It was noted that the water sometimes dribbles out.

- Applied a growth regulator on Marsh Hawk, practice putting greens & Blue Heron #5 – 13 greens to help control Poa annua population on greens
- Edged all bunkers & yardage plaques

New Business

FCCC/CCMA Survey Results – those pertinent to the Green Committee were reviewed and discussed. It was agreed that most of the issues were focused on the changes to Blue Heron and the golf course conditions which were present in the early spring. Both situations have since been addressed and resolved.

New Committee Members – Two new members from each of the associations – LGA & MGA – will be chosen to take the place of several outgoing members. They will be invited to attend the next meeting in November.

Open Discussion

The discoloration on multiple greens on Blue Heron was brought up. Steve explained that it was caused by a leak in one of the machines spreading fertilizer. The staff was made aware of it immediately and has already begun to remediate the situation.

The question was asked about the kind of aeration that would be done in November. Steve responded that it would be the deep needle tine with no cores.

A request was made to move the tee markers forward a little from the back of the teeing ground. Committee members agreed that some of the markers were almost outside of teeing ground. Steve said that he would take care of it.

It was reported that several of the laser reflectors have come off of the top of the 150 yd. markers. Steve said that they come off quite frequently and requested that if members find them they should turn them in to the pro shop.

Old Business

November meeting - canceled

Blue Heron – CCMA board asked if there would be any changes to Blue Heron. Steve responded that he knew of no planned changes

New Business

Blue Heron – request from a number of members (men & women) to have a few fairways cut a little closer to the tee – 1 or 2 mower passes; includes hole #'s 2,5,7, 9(second section) & 10. Steve said they will address it – should not be a problem.

Winter Maintenance Schedule - Question was asked about how often the following is done during the winter: greens & fairways mowed and/or repaired, holes & tee markers moved, greenside & fairway bunkers prepped, leaves removed. Steve said that it is done on an as needed basis, depending on the weather and based on the amount of play.

Blended Tees – New Markers? question was asked if it would be possible to make new markers to indicate the blended tees on Blue Heron (applies to ladies only). Steve said they could & could work on them over the winter.

Open Discussion

Staff #'s during the winter was discussed. Steve said they keep a basic crew, which is necessary to overhaul/service & repair equipment, refurbish ball washers, drinking fountains, tee markers, OB & hazard stakes, etc. and to schedule and plan for the 2010 season.
